


The "reality"

That vessels are routinely "dark", and other FMCs are blind Not Good







The Reality (of monitoring at FMCs)


In the absence of additional data, it is currently <u>not</u> <u>evident</u> to the relevant coastal flag State authorities (in this case, US Coast Guard and NOAA Office of Law Enforcement) whether these vessels are reliably reporting to their own FMC, are manual reporting to WCPFC, or may be non-compliant with WCPFC rules






















