Fish are removed from the water with nets






Violent methods such as stub, etc.







2.1 Fish Behavior and Fishing Mechanism

- Active Fishing Gear
 - A fishing device have to be moved, dragged, or towed in order to catch fish by trapping or encirclement
 - Usually requires engine-propelled boats
 - Designed to chase and capture target species

2.1 Fish Behavior and Fishing Mechanism

Passive Fishing Gear

- All fishing methods with static fishing gear in the water for a period before retrieval (stationary gears).
- No energy is expended on towing, pulling or dragging of gear.
- Attract fish using bait, or wait for a fish to swim into a net or trap.






Traps or pots

- Moveable Fishing Gears

- Moveable Fishing Gears
 - Moving from starting position during operation
 - By wind, water current, engine





- Stationary Fishing Gears
 - The gears those anchored or fixed to the seabed for the duration of a fishing operation
 - The frame remains in position all through its useful life






- Semi-Stationary Fishing Gear
 - The gear will fixed until the of each operation
 - The fisherman will change the position or fishing ground when capture is finished








1 Surrounding Nets (Purse Seine)

A net roughly rectangular in shape without a distance bag is set vertically in water; to surround the school of fish, generally of pelagic






1 Surrounding Nets (Purse Seine)

- Purse seine with a purse line
 - ✓ Chinese purse seine (*Uan tang-ke*)
 - ✓ Anchovy purse seine (Uan lom chub pla katak)
 - ✓ Thai purse seine (Uan daum)
 - ✓ Luring purse seine (Uan Sung and Uan tageang)
 - ✓ Tuna purse seine (Super seiner)










1 Surrounding Nets (Purse Seine)

- Surrounding net without purse line
 - ✓ Anchovy surrounding net (Uan glud takhao)
 - ✓ Rock-fish surrounding net (Uan Iom lung hin)









2 Seine Nets

- A bag net shaped with two long wing or just a rectangular net without a bag
- The net is pulled towards a stationary boat or onto a beach
- Fishing in day-time by 4-20 men, depending on the size of net
 - Beach seine
 - Boat seine
 - One boat seine
 - Two boat seine











- A conical bag shape-net with two or more wing
- Pulled by one or two boats for a period of time
- To catch mainly fish or other aquatic animals near the sea bed
- The most recently introduce, wide-spread and important gear in terms of production and number of fishing units












- Otter Board Trawl
- Pair Trawl











- Otter Board Trawl
 - The most widely operated gear in Thailand
 - Otter boards are used for horizontal spreading of the net mouth
 - There are 2 types: shrimps and fish trawl







- Pair Trawl
 - The nets is towing and net mouth is kept open by outward towing of the two boats
 - Always try to keep distance between them during operation
 - Usually operated in the day-time










- Beam Trawl
 - Using the beam to spread the net
 - Most beam are made of iron (2-4 m long)
 - Fishing ground are in shallow waters with muddy bottom
 - The principal catch are shrimps

4 Dredges

- These gear dragged along the bottom
- To collect such as scallops, short naked clams and clams
- The catch is held in a sort of bag or sieve which allows water, sand and mud to run out
- Short naked calm dredges
- Ark shell dredges
 - Dredges with handle
 - Dredges without handle
- Other dredges










5 Lift Nets


- These gear the net are square or conical
- Stretched either by rods, ropes, or a frame
- Set either at the bottom or in mid-water and then lifted to trap the fish lying above it
- Crab lift net
- Fish lift net
- Stationary lift net
- Stick-held dip-net












6 Falling Nets

- This gear usually a cone shaped net or other material
- Dropped to cover fishes and enclose them
 - Small cast net
 - Squid cast net
 - > Stick-held box net
 - > Stick-held cast net
















7 Gill Nets





9 Fyke-Nets (Set bag nets)

- The net is cone-shaped, net opening varies between 3x5 and 6x10 m. and the length are 15 to 30 m.
- Operated in shallow waters 3-6 m depth to catch shrimp, planktonic shrimp and miscellaneous fish
- Operated either by day or night, from after high tide to lowest tide
- There are 2 types of fyke-nets
 - Fixed set bag nets
 - Removable set bag nets







10 Stake Traps (Bamboo stake tap)

- The stationary gear used in coastal waters up to 20 m depth
- Consist of 3 parts:

<u>Leaders</u> (bamboo, stakes, netting); 2-5 in set to guide the fish into the trap

<u>Playground</u>; C-shape or triangular constructed of bamboo or wooden stakes driven into sea bed

Cod-end; Semicircular with bamboo stake frame and polyethylene net, funnel shaped to prevent the fish escaping.





11 Push Nets

- Consisting with a bag net and two poles to keep the net open
- Hand held push net
 - A small net and can be operated by one fisherman
- Push net
 - The larger net and pushed by engine
- The net has 3 distinct parts: upper and lower part, and the cod-end
 - The poles are either bamboo or iron pipe, 4-60 m long









12 Hook and Line
